P.P. Krishnapriya, Research Scientist at Sanford School of Public Policy

P. P. Krishnapriya is a research scientist at the Sanford School of Public Policy, Duke University. Prior to this, she was a visiting assistant professor at the Economics and Planning Unit, Indian Statistical Institute in Delhi. She graduated with a PhD in Economics from the Delhi School of Economics in 2017. Her doctoral research primarily studies the impact of information on households' choice of domestic energy. Her research interests are in energy, environment, development, labour and experimental economics.



Luciane Lenz, Researcher at RWI - Leibniz Institute for Economic Research

Luciane Lenz is a researcher in the research group Climate Change in Developing Countries at RWI. Her research focuses on the adoption of modern energy technologies in Sub-Saharan Africa, and its impacts on energy uses, (economic) wellbeing, health, and the environment. Among others, she studies potentials of on- and off-grid electrification in rural Rwanda, and the impacts of improved cooking stove in rural Senegal. Her work is published in World Development and the Journal of the Association of Environmental and Resource Economists.
